NOTICE OF ELECTION INFORMATION - 2026 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

NOTICE is hereby given to the Municipal Electors of the Town of Aurora

It's almost time! The 2026 Municipal Election will be held on **Monday, October 26, 2026**. Aurora voters will elect seven (7) members to Town of Aurora Council and four (4) Trustees to the local School Boards.

Voter Information Letters

Voter Information Letters will be mailed to all eligible voters on the Voters' List in early October. To ensure you receive your letter without delay, check that you're on the Voters' List and that your information is up to date.

Any eligible elector who is not on the list, or needs to change their information can do so:

- Online through **aurora.ca/Voters**
- In-person during regular business hours:
 - Town Administration Office located at **100 John West Way**, until **Friday, October 23** during business hours.
 - Aurora Public Library located at **15145 Yonge St.**, between **October 16** and **October 25**.

You must be on the Voters' List to vote. If you don't receive your Voter Information Letter, contact the Town's Elections Team for assistance.

Electors in the Town of Aurora have several ways to cast their ballot in the 2026 Municipal and School Board Election: internet voting, in-person during Advance Voting, or in-person at a ward specific voting location on Voting Day.

Option 1: Internet Voting

Vote from anywhere, from any device, at any time. Internet voting runs continuously from **10 a.m. on Friday, October 16, 2026, to 12 p.m. on Sunday, October 25, 2026**

Council passed By-law Number 6703-25 authorizing the use of voting and vote-counting equipment, such as optical scanning vote tabulators, as well as internet voting for the 2026 Municipal Election.

How to Vote online

To vote online, you must first opt-in. Go to the unique link provided in your Voter Information Letter. You will be asked to enter your personal information and Voter ID that is on your Voter Information Letter. Submit your request for approval. Upon approval, you will receive a unique Voter PIN and link to the Internet Voting System. You can access the Internet Voting System anytime from anywhere starting at **10 a.m. on Friday, October 16, 2026, to 12 p.m. on Sunday, October 25, 2026**. When you have accessed the system, you will be presented with an electronic ballot. Mark your ballot for each contest and click "Submit".

Option 2: In-person during Advance Voting

Vote in-person at the Aurora Senior's Centre during the Advance Voting Period!

Advance Voting will take place at the **Aurora Seniors' Centre**, located at **90 John West Way**. This voting location is open to all eligible electors in the Town of Aurora.

- **Saturday, October 17 - 12 p.m. to 6 p.m.**
- **Sunday, October 18 - 12 p.m. to 6 p.m.**
- **Monday, October 19 - 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.**
- **Tuesday, October 20 - 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.**
- **Wednesday, October 21 - 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.**

Option 3: In-person on Voting Day

Voting Day is Monday, October 26. Voting Locations will be open from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Your assigned voting locations can be found in your Voter Information Letter or at **aurora.ca/Wards**.

To vote on Voting Day, please bring your Voter Information Letter and an acceptable form of ID with you to vote. A complete list of accepted voter identification can be found at **aurora.ca/Voters**.

Accessibility at Voting Locations

Every effort has been made to ensure that each voting location is as accessible as possible. Here are the number of ways the Election Team is committed to providing an accessible voting process:

1. In preparation for the election, the Election Team visited every voting place to ensure all voting locations are accessible for electors and election workers.
2. The Aurora Senior's Centre will offer an **Accessible Vote Tabulator** to allow electors with disabilities to vote privately and independently through the use of its accessible features such as an Audio Tactile Interface, left-right paddles, and a sip-puff device.
3. A **friend, interpreter or support person** can also assist you at the voting location. The elector and the friend, interpreter or support person will have to swear an oath before assisting in casting the ballot behind the secrecy screen.

Proxy Voting

In accordance with Section 42(5) of the Act, voting proxies are **not applicable** to the 2026 Municipal and School Board Election.

Unofficial Results

Unofficial results will not be transmitted until after 8 p.m. on Voting Day - **Monday, October 26, 2026**. Unofficial results will be available at **aurora.ca/vote2026**.
