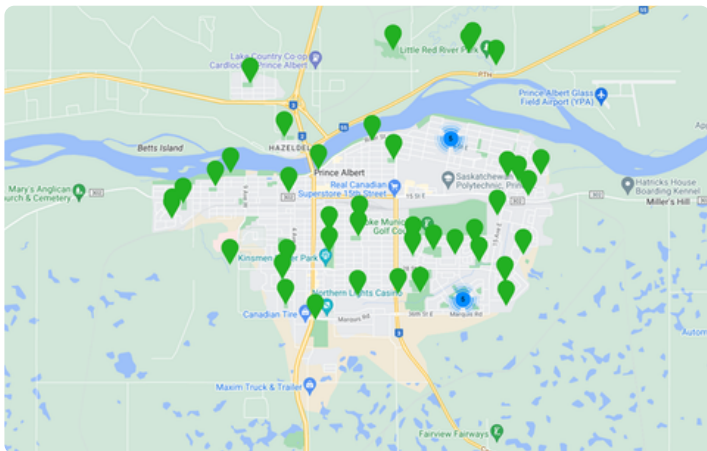

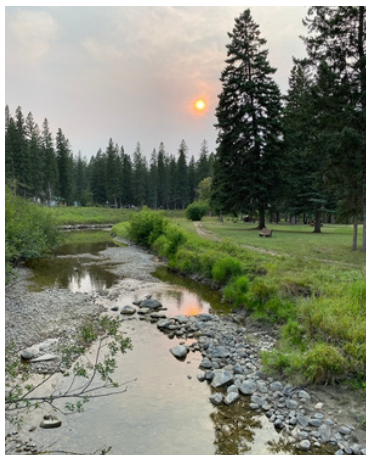

Métis Nation–Saskatchewan Ma Faamii Community Hub & Early Learning Centre

At the heart of Prince Albert's future is a deep respect for its roots. The Ma Faamii Community Hub will celebrate Métis heritage through cultural programming, language revitalization, and family services — all under one roof alongside a 90-space Early Learning and Childcare Centre of Excellence. It's a gathering place built to honour the past and invest in the next generation, and it's the kind of landmark that makes a city worth knowing.



Victoria Hospital Expansion & Acute Care Tower

World-class healthcare doesn't always mean travelling far from home — and for people across northern Saskatchewan, it soon won't have to. The Victoria Hospital redevelopment is one of the largest healthcare infrastructure projects in the province's history, bringing a new Acute Care Tower, expanded capacity, advanced diagnostics, and specialized care to Prince Albert. Designed with culturally welcoming spaces that reflect the region's First Nations and Métis communities, this is healthcare built with everyone in mind.



Ronald McDonald House Saskatchewan — Prince Albert

When families face their hardest moments, having a place to stay together makes all the difference. The new Ronald McDonald House, just steps from Victoria Hospital, will offer 12 family suites, warm communal spaces, play areas, and culturally inclusive amenities for families travelling to the city for their child's care. It's the kind of facility that reflects a community's character — and Prince Albert has that in abundance.

HISTORY



Interesting facts about Prince Albert:

- The oldest schools in the city are King George and PACI, both built in the early 1910s.
- The first two town constables, in 1885, had little to do with maintaining law. That responsibility was left to the NWMP.
- Prince Albert is made up of three original settlements: the Mission, Goschen in the east, and the Isbister Settlement in the west.
- The Diefenbakers owned the house — now the Museum — until 1975, when they gifted it to the City.
- A windmill once stood where the Historical Museum stands today, helping to date and place many of the city's early photographs.
- Prince Albert was the first city in Saskatchewan — in the Saskatchewan District, not today's province.

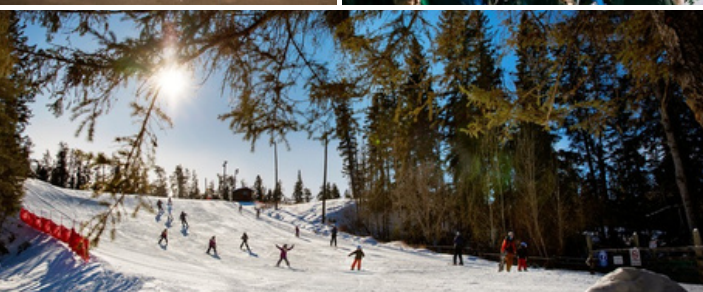

Snowmobiling

While snowmobiling within city limits is limited, a vast trail network lies just beyond. Thanks to the Saskatchewan Snowmobile Association and local club efforts, riders can explore over 80 km of well-groomed trails through prairie and boreal forest—offering scenic, exhilarating rides across central and northern Saskatchewan.

Winter Festival

For over 60 years, the Prince Albert Winter Festival has celebrated the city's heritage and northern spirit. Held every February, this two-week event combines tradition with fun—offering indoor and outdoor activities for all ages.

A crowd favourite is the sled dog race, drawing participants and spectators from across the region. It's a true northern tradition, inviting everyone to experience the warmth and excitement of winter in Prince Albert.



LITTLE RED RIVER PARK

Spanning 1,200 acres just north of the North Saskatchewan River, Little Red River Park is a year-round escape into nature—right within city limits.

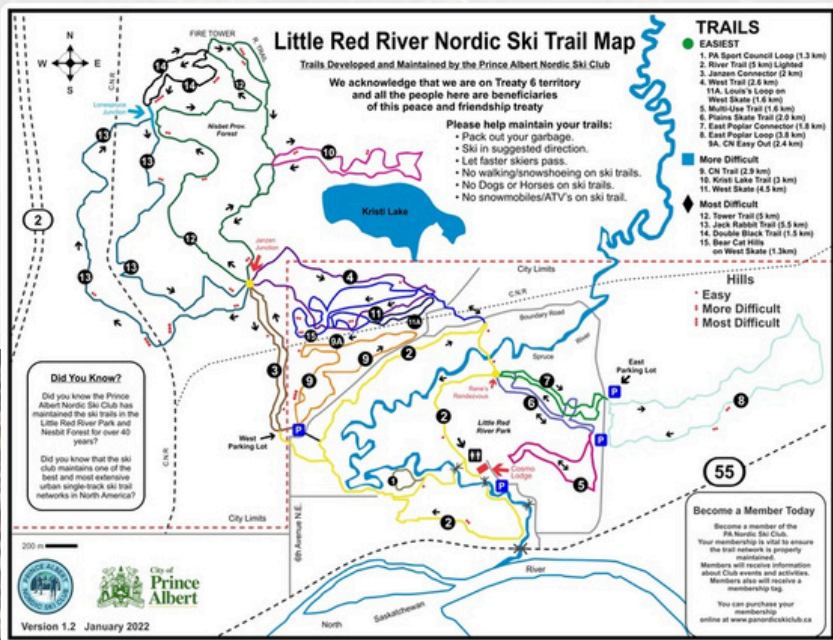
