Delegations

Mike Plumley addressed Council with a [request for exception to the Soil Acceptance By-law](#) regarding 5011 Loyalist Parkway.

Items for Consideration

- Council authorized two [naming rights agreements for the W.J. Henderson Community Centre](#). One agreement with Marion Budarick for the Sports Hall of Fame and the other agreement with the Amherstview Jets to assist in management of a fundraising sub-campaign through the charity portal of Canada Helps to raise \$50,000 for the Jets dressing room in memory of Don Ley.
- Council approved [By-law 2026-47 to authorize the borrowing of \\$3.2 million from Infrastructure Ontario for a 10-year term at 4.11% interest rate and By-law 2026-48 to authorize the borrowing of \\$8.4 million from Infrastructure Ontario for a 20-year term at 4.78% interest rate](#).
- Council approved and enacted By-law 2026-50, a by-law to establish and appoint members to the [Joint Compliance Audit Committee for the 2026-2030 term of Council](#).
- Council enacted [By-law 2026-44, being a by-law to lift part lot control requirements for Lot 1 on 29M-77 and Block 51 on 29M-61](#).
- Council supported a variance from the established [Encroachment By-law 2002-43 waiving the requirement for a Plan of Survey completed by an Ontario Land Surveyor](#) regarding 9600 South Shore Road.
- Council directed staff to bring forward a proposal for continuation of the [Community Tree Initiative](#) through the 2027 budget deliberations.

- Council authorized the extension of the advertising rights agreement with the Amherstview Jets Junior C Hockey Club for a one-year term starting in the 2026/2027 ice season with the option of a one-year extension for an annual fee of \$15,000.
- Council enacted the new Passenger Transportation Services By-law 2026-41, approved the amendments to the Transportation Network Company By-law 2022-022, and authorized the execution of service agreements with the City of Kingston to facilitate reciprocal licensing and enforcement of taxicab regulations in Loyalist Township.
- Council supported Building Ontario Together: HST Reinvestment for Municipal Infrastructure resolution and endorsed a support letter to be circulated.
