Municipal Policing Committee Member Application

The Town of Olds is seeking dedicated residents to help shape local safety priorities and support transparency in policing. Help shape the future of safety in Olds. Your voice ensures our local RCMP priorities reflect the values of our residents

About the Committee

The Municipal Policing Committee acts as a vital liaison between the community, Town Council, and the RCMP. Members provide input on policing priorities and review community concerns.

The Commitment

- **Meetings:** Typically held quarterly.
- **Term:** 2-year appointment.
- **Requirements:** Must be a resident of Olds, 18+ years of age, and demonstrate an interest in community governance.

The Application Process

Due to the sensitive nature of policing oversight, the Province of Alberta requires an **Enhanced Security Clearance**. [FAQ Enhanced Security Screening_.pdf](#)

This involves a detailed personal history disclosure by law enforcement to ensure that candidates are not a security concern due to unlawful activities or connections.

1. **Submit Interest:** Complete the brief application form [here](#).
2. **Council Appointment:** Council will evaluate applicants and make appropriate selections to best represent the demographics of the community.
3. **Review Package:** Once selected, the Legislative Clerk will contact you with the comprehensive provincial forms and a *Digital Signatures Guide* to assist you.
4. **Clearance:** Once forms are submitted, the security screening process will be initiated. Applicants are required to submit the background clearance forms provided, directly to the GoA as instructed in the information package provided. Results of the clearance will be shared with the applicant in detail, and only “cleared, or not cleared” with the municipality. It will be at the discretion of the Town of Olds based on the result if the applicant is suitable for continued appointment as outlined.
5. **Committee work:** Once the Committee has been formed, training and preliminary work can be started while the security clearance process is completed. Until full security clearance occurs, activities will be limited to “non-sensitive” participation only.

Why Join?

This is a high-impact role requiring professionalism and discretion. It is a unique opportunity to represent your neighbors and ensure local policing remains accountable and community focused.
