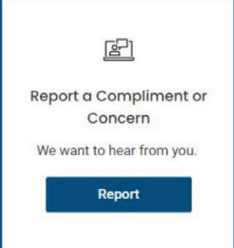

Residents will have the ability to order personalized tags online! Additionally the Town will update the licensing window from a calendar year approach to a 365-day model. Previously, dog licenses expired annually on December 31st, but through the new partnership with DocuPet, licenses are now valid for 365 days after purchase. This means that no matter what time of year residents purchase a dog’s license, it will be valid for 365 days.

REMINDERS



- WINTER REMINDERS**
The Town would like to remind residents and visitors of the following winter maintenance guidelines:
- Do not shovel, plow or blow snow on roads or sidewalks. This causes unsafe road conditions and is also against the law. If you have cleared your driveway, but Snowplows have not cleared your street, be prepared for a windrow at the bottom of your driveway.
 - Do not place your waste bins on snowbanks, icy surfaces, or on the road. Instead shovel a part of the curb area when possible to make room for waste bins, or place waste bins at the end of your driveway.
 - Winter Parking restrictions in effect. No vehicles are to be parked on any roadway between 12:00am and 8:00am every day.
 - Stay safe and stay off Storm Water Management Ponds, they are not for recreation. Do not toboggan or skate on Storm Water Management Ponds.

Staff make every effort to clear roads and sidewalks as quickly and effectively as possible and ask that residents please allow 24 hours after a snowstorm to make any clearing requests.
