During the hot, dry summer months, water consumption typically rises because of increased lawn watering, car washing and other outdoor uses, causing your water bill to increase and reserves to run low. Protect our environment by using the resources available to us wisely.

WATERING TIPS

- Invest in a rain barrel to collect rainwater. Water collected in your rain barrel is better for your garden because it doesn't contain any chlorine contaminants and is at ambient temperature.
- Water early! When you water on hot, sunny or windy days the majority of water is lost to evaporation. Watering in the morning means less water loss.
- Do not water when it is windy. Wind can blow sprinklers off target and speed up evaporation.
- Experts say you only need 2.5 cm (1 inch) of water, a week, including rainfall, to maintain a vibrant healthy lawn.
- When washing your vehicle, use a bucket with sponge plus a trigger nozzle and you will save litres of water.
- Use a cover on your pool when it is not being used. It will cut down on evaporation and keep it cleaner and warmer.
- STOP THE LEAKS!!** One drip per second will waste 10 cubic meters (2167 gallons of water). Water leaks may be silent with worn toilets flaps or dysfunctional softeners. Save money, find your leak!! Need help to find the leak, call the Town water/sewer department for assistance.

Clean Yards Bylaw

CLEAN YARDS BYLAW

On December 13, 2021, the Mayor, and Council passed a Clean Yards Bylaw that would become enforceable on April 15, 2022, allowing time for the application and approval of set fines. In response to Council direction to move from complaint driven enforcement to proactive enforcement Town of Shelburne Municipal Law Enforcement Officers will be conducting Proactive Enforcement Blitz's throughout the year.

Municipal Law Enforcement Officers began a Clean Yards Enforcement Blitz on Monday May 2, 2022. Enforcement this month will concentrate on accumulations of debris, waste and discarded items and materials in front and side yards, as well as inoperable vehicles, including trailers, and recreational vehicles. Officers will be attending to residential, commercial, and industrial areas. ALL VOTING IN THE TOWN OF SHELBURNE MUNICIPAL ELECTION WILL TAKE PLACE BY TELEPHONE OR INTERNET VOTING

Eligible voters will receive a voter instruction letter by mail outlining details on how to vote. This letter will provide voters with their Personal Identification Number (PIN) for access to the electronic voting system. The letter will also provide voters with the website to vote by internet and the phone number to vote by telephone. Check your mail in late September / early October.

Voting Period: Telephone and internet voting is available 24 hours a day from: Tuesday, October 11, 2022, at 9:30 a.m. to Monday, October 24, 2022 at 8:00 p.m.

A **Help Centre Kiosk** will be available to the public at the Shelburne Town Hall, 203 Main Street East, Shelburne for your voting convenience or if you require assistance to vote:

Tuesday, October 11 at 9:30 a.m. to Friday, October 21 at 4:30 p.m. (Monday to Friday)

Saturday October 15 and Saturday October 22 from 10:00am to 3:00 pm, and on Monday, October 24 (Voting Day) from 10:00 am until 8:00 pm.

Accessibility: It is the goal of the Town of Shelburne to ensure that all Electors who have a disability or have accessibility concerns are provided with the best opportunity to vote as independently as possible in the 2022 Municipal Election. **Residents requiring assistance and/or accommodations to vote are encouraged to contact the Clerk's Office (519) 925- 2600 Ext. 223 or jwilloughby@shelburne.ca by October 1, 2022.**

Voting Proxies: Voting proxies will not be granted for this election. Voters can vote by internet anywhere there is internet access, using a computer or device that is capable of connecting to the internet, or by telephone from anywhere in Canada or the continental United States using either a home phone or mobile phone.

Municipal Election October 24, 2022

The 2022 Municipal Election will offer telephone and internet voting.

Election day is Monday October 24, 2022.

Vote anywhere, anytime. Electors will be able to vote remotely using their own devices in the comfort of their home. Advantages include less travel, removing time constraints, and improved accessibility for persons with disabilities or people who are ill or away from home. The voting period for electors in the Town of Shelburne will be Tuesday, October 11, 2022, to Monday, October 24, 2022, at 8:00pm.

Nomination Day has moved to August 19, 2022, for the 2022 Municipal Election. Nominations open May 1, 2022.

As a reminder, nominations must be endorsed by 25 persons that are eligible to vote in the Town of Shelburne.

Am I on the voters' list?

If you are an Ontario resident over the age of 18, you should confirm that you're on the voters' list. Verify that your information is correct and if necessary, change your school support for electoral purposes or add names to your property address. Updating this information will help ensure that municipal voters' lists are accurate and up to date in preparation for the 2022 municipal and school board elections.
